MAY's Mission, Opportunity and Outreach (M.O.O.)

This month we are asking our church family to contribute to the **Addiction Referral Center** Building Fund Campaign in Marlboro. Commonly referred to as the "ARC", the program has been helping people in Hudson, Marlboro and surrounding communities for 45 years. It provides referrals, runs 12-step meetings every day of the week, and provides recovery coaching services at no cost to anyone struggling with addiction and their families.

The ARC has outgrown their current home. Covid-19 continues to fuel isolation, depression, anxiety and an increasing need for coping mechanisms. They have seen a surge in the demand for their services. They need to build a larger facility to accommodate the multitude of programs they have. Your donations will allow the purchase and renovation of a larger building which will hold conference rooms, a drop-in-center, office space, a computer / media lab, space for two Recovery Coaches, a large meeting space, and a kitchen that will ensure people with physical challenges can easily access the building.

It's very possible that someone in your life has received or could get help from ARC. A family in our church has been touched and affected by the effects of a family member's addiction. To witness the recovery in that person, that was achieved through using the services, meetings and other contact with the ARC's programs, is something that would not have happened without the help they received from the Center.
