Through this series, we can examine our relationship with God of our whole selves and can be witness to Christ's Presence in our lives.

UMCOR FLOOD BUCKETS



There is a need for flood buckets in response to the flooding caused by Hurricane Irene this weekend. **UMCOR Supply Kits** help to care for the most vulnerable people during times of

crisis. By donating kit supplies or financial gifts to purchase the supplies, you make a direct, tangible difference in sustaining people's lives.

5-gallon bucket with resealable lid - Buckets from fast food restaurants or bakeries can be used if washed and cleaned. Do not use buckets that have stored chemicals such as paint or pool cleaner. Advertisements on the outside are acceptable

- liquid laundry detergent (two 25 oz. or one 50 oz. bottles only)
- Iiquid household cleaner 12-16 oz. liquid cleaner that can be mixed with water, no spray cleaners
- dish soap 16-28 oz. bottle, any brand
- 1 can air freshener aerosol or pump
- 1 insect repellant spray 6 14 oz. aerosol spay pump
- 1 scrub brush plastic or wooden handle

- **18 cleaning wipes** handi wipes or reusable wipes; no terry cleaning towels
- 7 sponges
- 5 scouring pads
- 50 clothespins
- Clothesline two 50ft. or one 100ft.; cotton or plastic
- 24 roll heavy duty trash bags
- 5 dust masks
- 2 pair disposable kitchen gloves rubber or latex
- 1 pair work gloves cotton or leather

Important Notes

- All items must be new except for the actual bucket and lid.
- All cleaning agents must be liquid and in plastic containers. No powders please.
- If you cannot find the requested size of a liquid item, use a smaller size. Including larger sizes of any item will prevent the lid from sealing.
- Cleaning buckets are only used within the United States.

YOU DO NOT NEED TO BUY EVERYTHING ON THIS LIST. ONE OF THE ITEMS LISTED WILL MAKE A DIFFERENCE.
