Worship Committee Update

Have you noticed that colors in the sanctuary change throughout the year? The cloths that are hung in front of the lecterns and over the altar are known as paraments and they change to reflect the different seasons in the church:

- Purple is hung during Advent and Lent
- Nothing is hung on Good Friday
- Red is hung on Pentecost
- White is hung on special Sundays like Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, and Transfiguration Sunday
- **Green** is hung for the rest of the time, known as "ordinary time"

You may have noticed that the red paraments and kites that were hung for Pentecost stayed up for 2 extra Sundays. According to the liturgical calendar the colors should have been switched after Pentecost. Christine DiMare and her crew created such an impressive and joyful display, however, that it seemed right to keep them up for a few additional weeks. We hope you agree with that decision.
