Thoughts on Stewardship by Pam Sherman

Stewardship is living the vows we took when we joined the church; we promised to support the church with our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service, and our witness. This month I'd like to focus on service.

Service is the work we do for the church. Sometimes serving means joining a committee for several years, but this length of commitment may not be possible for some. Fortunately, there are opportunities to serve that require a commitment of a few hours only. For example, on

Memorial Day weekend, during the "Inside Church Cleanup", the people who came to serve helped clean out a storeroom that was in desperate need of attention. Some emptied the contents of the room into Wesley Hall, then emptied the boxes and sorted the contents into piles. Others examined items to make sure they still work as they should. A trash barrel was filled with unusable items like dry pens and markers, hardened Play Doh, and soiled stuffed animals. Several piles of items to be sold or given away



at the upcoming yard sale were created in a corner of Wesley Hall. Finally, some volunteers carried boxes with craft items to Lamson Hall to be stored with other craft items, while other volunteers placed the remaining items back into the storage room on newly labeled shelves. The entire job took 7 hours but no one worked the entire time and most volunteers worked only for a couple hours. This short act of service by a group of volunteers yielded impressive results.

Opportunities for short term service are presented to us every week in the announcements section of the bulletin and in Tuesday News Notes, and monthly in The Messenger. I encourage you to read about these opportunities and commit to volunteering to serve at least once in the next few months.
