Worship Updates from the Worship Committee

Communion continues to be offered on non-Communion Sundays immediately following the worship service. Rather than using bread and juice, however, prefilled Communion elements are now being offered. This change allows Communion to be served without anyone having to set up the elements and to clean up after Communion.



If you have attended church during October then you have noticed that the Postlude has been changed to "Music for Reflection" and has been moved before the Benediction. The change was made to allow us to still enjoy Margarita's music at the end of the service, while placing the Benediction in its proper place at the end of worship.
