Thoughts on Stewardship by Pam Sherman

Stewardship is living the vows we took when we joined the church; we promised to support the church with our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service, and our witness. This month I'd like to focus on **prayers.**

Most of the time when we pray, we either ask God for something we want or thank God for something we got. How often, however, do we listen to what God has to say to us? How do we even do that? One way is through Centering Prayer. You choose a word or a phrase, sit in a quiet place, pray that word or phrase over and over, and open yourself to God's presence. Random thoughts will inevitably enter your mind, and when that happens, gently set them aside and focus on the word or phrase.

I tried choosing a word (like Jesus or love) when I first tried Centering Prayer but found that I prefer praying a phrase. My favorite phrase is found in multiple Psalms:

Be still and know that I am God

My second favorite prayer phrase comes from 2 Corinthians 12:9:

My grace is sufficient for you
