Stewardship is living the vows we took when we joined the church; we promised to support the church with our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service, and our witness. This month I'd like to focus on gifts.

"Now wait", you may be thinking, "We heard about gifts at the end of October and beginning of November". Yes, you did. I had a few more thoughts, however, that I wanted to share with you.

For those of you who pledged, THANK YOU! Your pledge has enabled the Finance team to plan for the mission and ministries of our church in 2025.

For those of you who considered pledging, but haven't, it's not too late. Maybe you're still trying to figure out your budget for next year. For example, if you're on Medicare, you may still be weighing your options during open enrollment. Whenever you're ready, fill out a pledge card, put it in an envelope with "Financial Secretary" written on it, and then either put it in the offering place, bring it to the church office, or mail it to the church.

I know not everyone who gives, pledges. Maybe you don't like the word "pledge". Recently, I read a book entitled "Embracing Stewardship" and the author suggested using the term "estimate of giving". That made sense to me because I think the word "pledge" can sound intimidating. What do you think?

Did you know you don't have to get offering envelopes if you pledge? Some people are content to put a check in the plate or mail it to the church. Others use online bill pay and still others go to the church website and give online. There are so many options

nowadays. I'm old school. I like to write a check, put it in the envelope, and place the envelope in the offering plate. How about you?
