Early in the morning I was awakened by a faint sound that sounded like a baby bird. At first, I thought it was a dream and settled in to go back to sleep. Then I heard it again. I thought it was strange and I listened a little more closely. Then I knew what it was...It was my smoke detector letting me know that the battery needed to be replaced. Then, I eventually fell back to sleep.

The next morning, I wrote a message to my nephew as follows: "The day after Christmas I have a visitor who decided to visit me last night. This visitor decided to stay here but I would like him to leave. Can you help me? He doesn't have a name, but I call him "Chirp". Every so often he says that and Krisit (my dog) and I find him annoying. He is living in my living room." "Of course, I have a fresh battery ready...'He" is my smoke detector.

Because I am a visualist, I thought about that and related it to a sort of Christmas message.

Some people only attend church services only on Christmas and Easter. It is a time when, hopefully, they will hear a Christmas message. My hope is that they will think about the Pastor's words and be filled with a desire to return to worship more often. Most of the messages, as was the one we heard this Christmas, offers hope. Hope is an anticipation of something. Hope often gives us a reason for continuing to live always looking forward for something better, something more, more joy or a feeling of wellbeing, or less of something like depression, just plain feeling no good.

Now, how does that fit into the beginning of my words. First, we must hear the words, the chirp if you will. Then you must identify the word with the words of Christ. What is He trying to say? In the case of the smoke detector, it was telling me to get up and change the battery. In the case of Christ, His words tell us to do the same....Get up and change...Change..dare to abide by His words...go to church more often....listen more intently.

I asked my nephew to help me change the battery because I could not do it myself, it was too high. In order to know the meaning of the words of Christ, we need help at times, so ask for it...Make the change and live in peace...Live in the peace that can only come from Christ. Our Savior, our Redeemer.



My hope, my wish, is always that all those attending worship services on Christmas will be motivated to seek change as we sing hymns and hear the word of Christ and in so, be filled with the hope and promises of Christ, our Savior and Redeemer.
