Thoughts on Stewardship by Pam Sherman

Stewardship is living the vows we took when we joined the church; we promised to support the church with our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service, and our witness. This month I'd like to focus on prayers.

Most the time when I pray, I start by thanking God and then I launch into my requests: Please let the test results be negative; please make the chemo work; please heal the relationship; please reduce the anxiety; please, please, please. There is nothing wrong with asking God for any of those things. That is part of my relationship with God. So is listening to what God has to say to me (I wrote about listening to God last August). What I realized, however, is that I don't spend much of my prayer time thanking God, and that is something I want to change. For the month of February, I am committing to the following actions:

- 1. When I pray, I will still make requests, but I'm going to spend most of my prayer time thanking God.
- 2. I'm going to revive my gratitude journal. This is something I started during the pandemic when I needed to be reminded of the good things in my life. Every evening, I would write down one thing I was grateful for. Once the pandemic receded, I got complacent and stopped writing. Now it is time to start again. What I like about a gratitude journal is that on days when I'm struggling to find much to be grateful for, I can look back through the journal and see what I was grateful for in the past.

This month, I encourage you to commit to thanking God more often either through the methods I plan to use or through other methods.
